





PLACE OF ORIGIN OF PATIENT:




Number of Patient Visits

III HIGHLIGHTS OF 2018

2018 proved to be an extremely successful year for the Patient Behbud Society (PBS). Below are some of the major accomplishments and new additions that occurred over the last year.

PBS DONOR DINNER



One of the major efforts to connect with our donors was the annual dinner which was an opportunity to celebrate how our supporters helped us impact over 9,000 lives. There were several highlights that encompassed this dinner; President Firoz Rasul who shared the economic impact of our generous donors; Nadeem Mustafa Khan who highlighted the performance of PBS in 2017, Dr. Zehra Fadoo who emphasized the awareness that was required for pediatric oncology, and Dr. Saulat Fatimi who discussed adult cardiology. All the donors were very appreciative of being invited and learning of their contributions' impact on society.

AKU'S SCHOOL PROGRAM – "KIDS FOR KIDS"



The Aga Khan University Hospital (AKUH) School Programme is designed to give students a learning opportunity to be part of a social cause that will help in raising funds for underprivileged children of the AKUH Paediatric Wards.

The impact of this unique program has been not just to raise funds and awareness for the AKUH Paediatric Welfare Fund but the opportunity for school children to personally hand a teddy bear to all inpatient paediatric patients, spreading smiles and giving the participants a sense of gratitude has been extremely rewarding for all participants.

LIVES CHANGED

HOPE RESTORED



My name is Waqas Ahmed and I came to the Aga Khan University Hospital seeking treatment for my son, Rehmat Raza. Since a month and a half after his birth we had learnt that Rehmat had a VSD (a hole in the wall separating the two lower chambers of the heart), and also started showing symptoms of pneumonia and fever. It had been over a year that we were seeking treatments at various government hospitals, yet there seemed to be no cure. Our family became extremely strained financially, and every rupee we had ended up going towards his ineffective treatment. We had lost all hope. After reading about AKUH's Patient Welfare Program in the newspaper, we thought we would try our luck and see if they would be able to help. Once we told the welfare department our story, it was like hope had finally returned to our family. From the smoothness of the process, the quality of the care, and the attention paid by all the doctors and nurses, we felt so well taken care of at AKUH. There was no difference in the treatment we received even though we were welfare patients. The respect we were given at AKUH was unlike any other hospital we have been to before. And, I want to thank all those that donated to make this possible, and urge others to donate, so that others like my son can live.

A LIFE GIVEN BACK



My name is Mohammad Hanif and I was admitted at AKUH for four days for a bypass surgery. Coming from Hussainabad, Karachi, there are no major hospitals available where I live. After noticing a lot of water retention in my body and experiencing physical pain, I continued taking the medication prescribed from my local physician, yet, the treatment seemed ineffective. Then, one day, I reluctantly came to AKUH, thinking that treatment here would be beyond my financial means. Still, I decided to approach the welfare department as I was still in pain, and they were extremely accommodating. They took the time to fully understand my situation and made me feel at ease. Not just that, but hope has now returned to my family after my treatment at AKUH. Today, I am able to continue living my life, because of the help I received at AKUH and I am grateful for all the help this institution has provided to me and my family.

FAITH REWARDED



My name is Najma, and I work as a cook in somebody's house. I began experiencing some pain and started noticing some swelling in my hand. I went to a doctor who mentioned that I would need a CT scan, which then led to an MRI, and a whole lot of other tests. Finally, they determined that I might need an operation but the cost of the procedure proved far beyond what me or my family could afford. We never thought we would ever be able to afford the treatment at AKUH, or the fact that there was an option for welfare here. But we decided to try our luck and faith in Allah, my brain surgery was performed successfully here and it wasn't financially damaging for me or my family. AKUH and their welfare made it possible for me to continue living a happy life free of the financial constraints of a surgery, and for that, my family and I are eternally grateful.

SHARIAH CERTIFICATION

Shariah approval for paying zakat to The Patients' Behbud Society for Aga Khan University Hospital (PBS)

Introduction:

The Patients' Behbud Society for Aga Khan University Hospital (PBS) is registered as an independent, charitable society engaged in collecting and disbursing zakat in order to help mustehiq patients receive high quality medical treatment at the Aga Khan University Hospital (AKUH), its clinics and medical centers, under its management and supervision, primarily from zakat funds.

Since inception in 2001, PBS has provided financial support to thousands of mustehiq patients, who are the most underprivileged members of society, without any discrimination or compromise in the quality of care. A meticulous financial need assessment process is being followed to identify the most deserving patients who are eligible as mustehiq for zakat. Men, women and children are provided primary, secondary and tertiary healthcare. PBS ensures that the Hospital's cutting edge research and technology is accessible to the most vulnerable patients, particularly against life-threatening illnesses.

System of utilization of zakat:

PBS collects zakat from individuals, companies, trusts and foundations in Pakistan and from abroad, and deposits zakat money in Shariah compliant Islamic bank accounts. The money collected is then utilized for the treatment of zakat mustehiq patients at AKUH. The process starts with Welfare Office at AKUH conducting a financial need assessment of patients to determine their zakat eligibility in accordance with Shariah principles and directions. If a person is determined to be eligible for zakat, only then Welfare Office gets the authorization from such zakat mustehiq patients to collect zakat on their behalf and spend it directly on their treatment or on treatment of other zakat mustehiq patients at AKUH.

To ensure that the whole system and process is Shariah compliant, both in letter and spirit, the undersigned have been appointed as independent Shariah Advisors to review all zakat related documents, systems and procedures.

Shariah Ruling:

Having carried out the above review, we confirm that the Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH collects and disburses zakat funds in accordance with the principles and directions of Shariah. It is also confirmed that whosoever donates zakat to the Society; their zakat stands discharged as per Shariah's principles and directions.

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INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE PATIENTS' BEHBUD SOCIETY FOR AKUH

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of The Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH (the Society), which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2018, and the statement of income and expenditure, the statement of changes in net assets and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and the notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Society as at December 31, 2018, and its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan.

Basis for Opinion

THE PATIENTS' BEHBUD SOCIETY FOR AKUH NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2018

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 The Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH (the Society) was established by well wishers of the Aga Khan University Hospital (the Hospital) under a constitution dated June 22, 1993 (the Constitution) for supporting needy patients seeking treatment at the Hospital through Zakat funds available with the Society. The Society is currently governed and managed under the amended constitution of 2002. The Society is registered under the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961 (XLVI of 1961) since August 23, 1993. The principal office of the Society is situated at the Aga Khan University Hospital, Stadium Road, P.O. Box 3500, Karachi 74800.

The following funds are being managed by the Society in order to pursue its aforementioned objectives:

(a) Zakat Fund - Externally restricted

The Zakat Fund of the Society has been established for providing financial assistance to the needy patients seeking treatment at the Hospital through Zakat Fund available with the Society. Major contributions include zakat collected, transfer by the Society through the surplus as well as donations received from various sources.

(b) General Fund - Unrestricted

General Funds are utilised for meeting general and administrative expenses of the Society. Donations contributed by the donors for general purposes / operations are recognised under the General Fund upon receipt.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

2.1 Basis of preparation and statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except as otherwise disclosed in the accounting policies presented.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Accounting and Financial Reporting Standards for Small Sized Entities (AFRS for SSE) and the Accounting Standards for Not for Profit Organisations (NPOs) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan (ICAP).

2.2 Cash and bank balances

Cash and bank balances are carried in the statement of financial position at cost. Cash and bank balances comprise of cash in hand and deposits held with banks.



2.3 Revenue recognition

- Zakat / Donations are recognised on receipt basis.
- Profit on bank balances is recognised on accrual basis on the principal amount outstanding using the applicable profit / mark-up rate.
- Donations in kind are recognised at fair value.

2.4 Disbursements

Disbursements are recognised as commitments when these are approved by the Executive Committee. Subsequent to approval, these amounts are paid to the Hospital on behalf of Mustahigeen patients.

2.5 Taxation

The Society does not account for taxation, as non-profit organisations are allowed a tax credit equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the tax payable including minimum tax and final tax payable, under section 100C of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

Presently no significant estimates / judgements have been made for the preparation of these financial statements.
