SALIENT FEATURES OF PE AKUH

Mr S M Pervez, Vice President, PBS for AKUH

An ardent member of PBS for AKUH, Mr S M Pervez joined the Society over 13 years ago. For him, his reasons for supporting PBS for AKUH are clear:

"The entire system for investigating and approving zakat mustehiq patients is more transparent and better managed than any other institution I have ever come across".

The salient features of PBS for AKUH are what set it apart for Mr Pervez:

"None of the staff or doctors at the hospital are aware whether a particular patient is being treated with zakat, or is a private paying patient. This allows for the patient to retain his or her integrity, and also means that there is absolutely no difference in the treatment offered to paying patients and zakat patients.

Zakat and other donations are never used to cover the Hospital's overheads or administrative expenses. These are borne by the Hospital itself. This means that your zakat is being utilised for the cause it was given towards, and not a penny is being spent otherwise.

The most important feature is that despite AKUH being a last-resort hospital for most patients who require financial support, majority of these patients go back after successful procedures. This is testament to the fact that AKUH is well equipped to treat all ailments, with appropriate equipment and highly qualified doctors and staff.

The Hospital's certifications from Joint Commission International and the Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy are also testament to the institution's transparency and adherence to international standards. Shariah compliance is ensured by the two Muftis on board".

Finally, Mr S M Pervez echoed the sentiments of all our welfare and zakat patients

"Truly, AKUH is a blessing for Pakistan!"

The Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH is a registered, independent, charitable society engaged in collecting and disbursing zakat and other donations. These donations are used to support the medical treatment of zakat mustehiq patients, at Aga Khan University Hospital.

PBS accepts donations primarily in the form of zakat, but also sadaqat and grants, for disbursement in compliance with Shariah principles and guidelines, at AKUH and its various clinics and medical centres. All donations are utilised solely for the treatment of zakat mustehiq patients. The required administrative expenses of PBS are entirely borne by AKUH. THE IMPACT OF YOUR GIVING (2019)

In 2019 The Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH has managed to disburse PKR 318,848,243 across Pakistan, to zakat mustehiq patients, thanks to your generosity.

The largest proportion of the sum disbursed, approximately 84%, was used to support 1,881 in-patient visits to the Stadium Road facility and four secondary hospitals in Karachi.

Donor Dinner at Sind Club

Mr Anwar Rammal, Member, Executive Committee, PBS hosted a dinner at Sind Club in January, 2019 on behalf of PBS for AKUH. In addition to PBS members, 52 guests attended the event. This event was organised to create awareness about PBS and highlight the challenges faced by cardiology patients who cannot afford treatment.

Dr Osman Faheem, Director of Structural Heart Disease and Section Head of Cardiology, addressed the gathering with a presentation about adult cardiology and the aspirations of the Cardiology Department at AKUH. He shared that between 2016 and 2018, PKR 955 million had been used by the department to benefit over 2,000 patients.

He ended his presentation by highlighting that the Cardiology Department at AKUH aims to treat 800 welfare patients in 2019, for which PKR 400 million would be required. He stated that although PKR 300 million would be arranged from other sources, the Department was looking to generous donors to cover the shortfall of PKR 100 million, that would be used to treat mustehiq cardiology patients from low income households.



Donor Acknowledgment Dinner at President Firoz Rasul's Residence

President Firoz Rasul and Dr Saida Rasul hosted a dinner in April, 2019, to celebrate the generosity of PBS for AKUH's donors. President Rasul addressed the gathering of 130+ guests and thanked them for their support to AKUH, and specifically to PBS. He shared a presentation with the guests about the impact of their generosity; the number of beneficiaries their donations had served, and the hospital's contribution to the Patient Welfare Programme.

Mr Nadeem Mustafa Khan also addressed the gathering, and spoke about PBS in particular; its specific mandate, its adherence to Shariah Law, and its commitment to serving mustehiq patients. This was followed by a comprehensive presentation by Dr Osman Faheem about adult cardiology and the challenges faced by cardiology patients in Pakistan. He ended his presentation with a video testimonial about Congenital Heart Disease - a life threatening birth defect present in infants.

In addition to the family featured in the video testimonial, another gratified patient's family was also present at the dinner. They expressed their gratitude to PBS and AKUH for allowing their daughter a new lease on life, and allowing them access to high quality healthcare that they had never thought they could afford for their daughter. Both parents were visually impaired, and they were heavily invested in their daughter's recovery as she was the only member of the family with the sense of sight. Their words brought to life the impact of our donors' generosity.



Iftar for Friends of PBS

Mr Mehtab Chawla (Late), Member, Executive Committee, hosted an Iftar at his residence for friends and well-wishers of PBS in May, 2019. The 150+ guests that attended the event were given an introduction to PBS, and the challenges faced by patients (mostly paediatric patients) suffering from Congenital Heart Disease in Pakistan.

One of AKUH's most well established paediatric cardiologists, Dr Babar Hasan was present at the event, and shared AKUH's role in addressing the challenges faced by patients from lowincome families. He emphasised how donor support can transform and often save the lives of mustehiq patients. He also highlighted that AKUH was one of the leading private facilities in the country where two qualified paediatric cardiac surgeons were present under one roof.

In addition to our esteemed guests and faculty, a beneficiary family was also present at the event. Waqas Ahmed, whose son Rehmat was born with a hole in the wall that separates the two lower chambers of his heart, had done the rounds at various hospitals in the city to find a way to help his son. The financial strain due to several ineffective treatments and watching his son suffer was getting all too much for Waqas and his family had lost all hope. It was the welfare department at AKUH that restored his hope in healthcare in Pakistan, and his son now leads a healthy life thanks to the expertise of our doctors and the generosity of our donors.

The data shared by Dr Babar, coupled with Rehmat's story, were so powerful that through this event, PBS raised PKR 13 million.



Fundraising Dinner for PBS

Dr Yahya Chawla, Member, PBS Executive Committee, hosted a dinner for his friends and family to demonstrate the impact that PBS has had on neurosurgery patients at AKUH. More than 120 guests attended the dinner.

Dr Chawla welcomed the guests and expressed his reasons for believing in the mission of, and dedicating his time to PBS. In doing so he highlighted all of PBS's unique features.

Two very well respected neurosurgeons from AKUH were present at the dinner. Dr Ather Enam, Professor & Chair Department of Surgery, explained that a team of 9 skilled neurosurgeons certified to perform a range of surgeries contribute to a comprehensive and multidisciplinary approach towards treatment at AKUH. Other unique procedures offered at AKUH include Awake Craniotomy performed with the use of a Neuro-Robotic Exoscope. This enhances surgical precision and shortens patient recovery time. AKUH is the first facility outside of North America to offer this to its patients. He identified some of the challenges faced by patients in Pakistan, which include the lack of standards across the country; inadequate training for professionals; little emphasis on research; and financial challenges.

Dr Aneela Darbar, Assistant Professor Department of Surgery, one of the very few female Neurosurgeons in Pakistan (and PBS Execuytive Committee Member), spoke about the issues faced by patients who require financial support in accessing quality treatment in Pakistan. In 2018, 1,741 patients were operated upon at AKUH and 50% of them received financial support totalling PKR 163.3 million. She thanked all the donors who supported these procedures and shared stories of some of her patients. She then invited the guests to donate to this cause.

More than PKR 7.5 million were raised as a result of this dinner.

PBS for AKUH's School Programme (I)

The School Programme gave students from 39 branches of 25 schools in Karachi, Hyderabad, and Lahore, an opportunity to be part of a worthy social cause. These students helped raise funds for underprivileged children receiving treatement in the Paediatric Ward at AKUH. Through these 35,000 students, we managed to reach over 30,000 households with information about PBS and its impact on patients from low-income households. This experience inculcates the concept of philanthropy in children from a very young age, allowing them to witness the impact of their generosity on those who are not as privileged.

The City School deserves special mention for including 14 branches from Karachi and Hyderabad to participate in this programme. Their contribution has significantly helped us in reaching more households with relevant information.

For AKUH, partnering with schools paves the way for long term affinity and makes our Patient Welfare Programme the cause of choice for children to support. Students who donated the most generously were invited to AKU to meet the benficiaries; they were also rewarded with gifts for their philanthropic efforts. With this Programme, we are working to create future donors for our communities and our country.



PBS for AKUH's School Programme (II)

For two years in a row, the students of Dawood Public School have managed to collect the largest sums of money for disbursement to the Paediatric Ward at AKUH.

Outreach in the United States

Sheikh Ali Hussain, Honorary Secretary of the Executive Committee, visited the United States for PBS related awareness raising and fundraising activities. He, along with Dr Babar Hasan, met with members of the AKU Alumni community and other Pakistani diaspora settled in the United States to raise awareness with regards to PBS and zakat donations. The objective of these meetings was to introduce PBS to high net-worth individuals who were unfamiliar with the Society, and to demonstrate the needs of zakat mustehiq patients. The audience was moved by the extremely impactful work being done by AKUH and PBS to improve access to quality healthcare for zakat mustehiq patients.

These sessions were arranged across the United States, in Chicago, Houston, New Jersey, Washington DC, Memphis, LA and Bay Area. More than 350 guests attended these sessions and the impact of PBS resonated deeply with them due to its unique feature: maintaining the dignity of zakat mustehiq patients and all other welfare patients by not revealing to the medical staff whether patients are being financially supported or not.

They were given all relevant details about the assessment process, such as needs assessment in a private room, ensuring Shariah compliance, and disbursing funds as per Shariah guidelines.

All guests were extremely appreciative of PBS's work.



Agreements with Pharmaceutical Companies: Sanofi Pakistan Ltd.

On July 25th, 2019, Sanofi Pakistan Ltd. and PBS for AKUH announced a collaboration to support patients suffering from breast, head and neck, and prostate cancer through a "Patient Access Programme". The initiative is designed to help reduce financial burden on patients from low income households.

Breast cancer is the most common type of cancer in women worldwide and Pakistan ranks #1 in Asian countries with the highest incidence of breast cancer. The rising incidence of head and neck, and prostate cancer in Pakistan is also alarming therefore the need for such programmes is crucial. With an increasing number of patients and rising costs of healthcare, this collaboration enables PBS to extend assistance to a greater number of patients.

At the MoU signing ceremony, Asim Jamal (MD & GM, Sanofi Pakistan), said, "Ensuring equitable access for all is a complex challenge, therefore we are constantly innovating for solutions that contribute to scaling up efficient health systems. Through this partnership, PBS and Sanofi shall be playing their part in promoting access to cancer therapy for mustehiq patients."



Agreements with Pharmaceutical Companies: Pfizer Pakistan Ltd.

On 25th February, 2019, PBS for AKUH entered into a partnership with Pfizer Pakistan Ltd., one of the leading pharmaceutical companies in the country. The partnership was established to provide access to quality treatement in the form of targeted therapy to cancer patients without financial means.

Patients suffering from gastrointestinal stromal tumor (GIST), metastatic renal cell carcinoma (MRCC) and pancreatic neuroendocrine tumors (pNET) will benefit most from the partnership. The announcement came during an official signing ceremony held at the Aga Khan University Hospital premises in Karachi. It comes as part of Pfizer's patient access programme for cancer patients: 'MASEEHA'.

Dr. Adnan A. Jabbar, Associate Professor and Section Head Medical Oncology, AKUH said, "Disparity in care is a major challenge across the world with cost of treatment being a major contributor in low and middle income countries like Pakistan. Programmes like this help oncologists reduce this gap in treatment outcome by providing highly effective drugs for their patients who may otherwise not have been able to benefit from them."

Pfizer has been collaborating with healthcare providers, governments, and local communities around the world to support and expand access to reliable, affordable health care. In Pakistan, Pfizer has been operational for over 60 years.





TRANSFORMING LIVES THE STORY OF SAGHEER'S RECOVERY

Sagheer lives in a rented property in a slum in Karachi. He has one son and five daughters to support. He began suffering from breathlessness and coughing after exertion, for which he visited a local hospital in his area. There he was told that his angiography is showing more than two blocked arteries, and that he will immediately require a bypass surgery in order to avoid a life threatening event.

"We had never imagined going to Aga Khan University Hospital", Sagheer said. "We had never set foot in the premises, nor did we ever think that we had the financial strength, or that our lives were valuable enough to deserve getting treated there".

The doctor at his local hospital insisted that Sagheer visit AKUH, and took him to the welfare office, where he was told after a stringent financial assessment, that he was eligible for zakat and that his treatment would be subsidised by up to 80%.

"We couldn't believe it!", Sagheer recalls. "It was always going to be a difficult surgery, but our minds were at ease knowing that we are in the best hands. I will never forget that the finest doctors at Aga Khan University Hospital treated me, and saved my life."



PRESERVING INNOCENCE

ABDUL REHMAN'S MIRACULOUS JOURNEY

For months after his birth, Abdul Rehman was in and out of the hospital as his health was never stable, and doctors could not figure out the source of the problem. It was only after thorough investigation and multiple tests that a child specialist was able to tell his parents that Abdul had a hole in his heart, and would require immediate surgery.

Abdul was about 6 months old when his predicament came to light, and the parents did not have the luxury of time. They turned to Aga Khan University Hospital where Dr Waris explained to them in detail, the nature of Abdul's ailment; unfortunately the cost to rectify this was coming up to PKR 850,000.

"We live in a rented property in Mominabad; this sum of money was going to be impossiblee for us to arrange", recalls Abdul's father. "Dr Waris was kind enough to guide us through the welfare process, and they carried out a thorough assessment of our needs and capacity".

A week after the assessment, Abdul's parents got the call that changed their son's life, and theirs. They were told that they were eligible for zakat through PBS and that Abdul's operation was going to be conducted at AKUH.

"It was a 5-6 hour surgery, and it wasn't such that just because we were on welfare we were treated as second-grade citizens - in fact, we were treated like VIPs", Abdul's father stated.

"Today, my child is able to play, laugh, be mischievous - take full advantage of his innocence - and this is all thanks to Aga Khan University Hospital. They are the reason my son is alive and well; I simply cannot thank them enough".

<u>Shariah approval for paying zakat to The Patients' Behbud Society</u> <u>for Aga Khan University Hospital (PBS)</u>

Introduction:

The Patients' Behbud Society for Aga Khan University Hospital (PBS) is registered as an independent, charitable Society engaged in collecting and disbursing zakat, in order to help *mustahiq* patients receive high quality medical treatment at the Aga Khan University Hospital (AKUH), its clinics and medical centers, under its management and supervision, primarily from zakat funds.

Since inception in 2001, PBS has provided financial support to thousands of *mustahiq* patients, who are the most underprivileged members of society, without any discrimination or compromise in the quality of care. A meticulous financial need assessment process is being followed to identify the most deserving patients who are eligible as *mustahiq* for zakat. Men, women and children are provided primary, secondary and tertiary healthcare. PBS ensures that the Hospital's cutting edge research and technology is accessible to the most vulnerable patients, particularly against life-threatening illnesses.

System of utilization of zakat:

PBS collects zakat from individuals, companies, trusts and foundations in Pakistan and from abroad, and deposit zakat money in Shariah compliant Islamic bank accounts. The money collected is then utilized for the treatment of zakat *mustahiq* patients at AKUH. The process starts with Welfare Office at AKUH conducting a financial need assessment of patients to determine their zakat eligibility in accordance with Shariah principles and directions. If a person is determined to be eligible for zakat, only then Welfare Office gets the authorization from such zakat *mustahiq* patients to collect zakat on their behalf and spend it directly on their treatment or on treatment of other zakat *mustahiq* patients at AKUH.

To ensure that the whole system and process is Shariah compliant, both in letter and spirit, the undersigned have been appointed as independent Shariah Advisors to review all zakat related documents, systems and procedures.

Shariah Ruling:

Having carried out the above review, we confirm that the Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH collects and disburses zakat funds in accordance with our rulings and guidance as Shariah Advisors pursuant to the principles and directions of Shariah. It is also confirmed that whosoever donates zakat to the Society; their zakat stands discharged as per Shariah's principles and directions.

May Allah SWT grant management of the Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH best reward for their services and give in their mission more blessings and sincerity. *Aameen*

THE PATIENTS' BEHBUD SOCIETY FOR AKUH NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2019

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 The Patients' Behbud Society for AKUH (the Society) was established by well-wishers of the Aga Khan University Hospital (the Hospital) under a constitution dated June 22, 1993 (the Constitution) for supporting needy patients seeking treatment at the Hospital, clinics and medical centers under its management and supervision through Zakat funds available with the Society. The Society is currently governed and managed under the amended Constitution of 2002. The Society is registered under the Voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration and Control) Ordinance, 1961 (XLVI of 1961) since August 23, 1993. The principal office of the Society is situated at the Hospital, Stadium Road, P.O. Box 3500, Karachi 74800.

The following funds are being managed by the Society in order to pursue its aforementioned objectives:

(a) Zakat Fund / Donations - Externally Restricted

The Zakat Fund of the Society has been established for providing financial assistance to the needy patients seeking treatment at the Hospital through Zakat Fund available with the Society. Major contributions include zakat collected, transfer by the Society from the surplus as well as donations received from various sources.

(b) General Fund - Unrestricted

General Funds are utilised for meeting general and administrative expenses of the Society. Donations contributed by the donors for general purposes / operations are recognised under the General Fund upon receipt.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented, unless otherwise stated.

2.1 Basis of preparation and statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except as otherwise disclosed in the accounting policies below.

These financial statements has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Accounting and Financial Reporting Standards for Small Sized Entities (AFRS for SSE) and the Accounting Standards for Not for Profit Organisations (NPOs) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan (ICAP).

2.2 Cash and bank balances

Cash and bank balances are carried in the statement of financial position at cost. Cash and bank balances comprise of cash in hand and deposits held with banks.



2.3 Revenue recognition

- Zakat / Donations are recognised on receipt basis.
- Profit on bank balances is recognised on a time proportion basis on the principal amount outstanding using the applicable profit/mark up rate.
- Donations in kind are recognised at fair value.

2.4 Disbursement

Disbursements are recognised as commitments when these are approved by the Executive Committee. Subsequent to approval, these amounts are paid to the Hospital on behalf of Mustahiqeen patients.

2.5 Taxation

The Society does not account for taxation, as non-profit organisations are allowed a tax credit equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the tax payable including minimum tax and final tax payable, under section 100C of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

The preparation of financial statements require management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectation of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Presently no significant estimates / judgements have been made for the preparation of these financial statements.
