ZAKAT SUPPORT AT AKUH LABS HELPED SAVE SHAHZAIN'S LIFE

Shahzain, hailing from Thatta, was born one month premature and for the first three months of his life, remained extremely frail.

Shahzain suffered from malnutrition and struggled with maintaining a healthy bodyweight. He was regularly in and out of the hospital but fortunately survived this fragile period and began growing and gaining weight at a healthy pace.

Eighteen months later, Shahzain was visiting his grandmother Nasima, who noticed that he was extremely lethargic and unable to sit up properly. She readily consulted a local doctor who prescribed Shahzain blood tests for malaria, iron-levels, as well as a complete blood count.

Nasima knew that the most reliable tests were done at AKUH's labs after her employer had taken her there to get her checkup, but she was worried about the cost of getting the tests done.

"If we hadn't tested Shahzain at AKUH, who knows what his condition would have become? The quality and speed of the tests saved my grandson's life."

Upon reaching the lab, Nasima explained to the staff her family's strained financial circumstances and was relieved to hear that they would be eligible for Zakat, which would significantly reduce the cost of the tests. Less than eight hours later, Nasima received a call from AKUH Laboratories informing her that Shahzain had malaria as well as a danger-



ously low haemoglobin count. The AKUH lab assistant also advised Nasima that Shahzain be treated immediately as his situation could quickly deteriorate.

The family rushed the little boy to the hospital where he was admitted and treated for five days. His situation improved significantly and he is now gaining weight again, and able to move around.

Timely and accurate diagnostics helped Shahzain get access to quality healthcare when it mattered the most.

The Zakat programme at AKUH laboratories helps many individuals, such as Shahzain, access reliable diagnoses and treatment.



PATIENTS' BEHBUD SOCIETY'S NEW LEADERSHIP

HEPATITS-C - PROGRAMME UPDATE

The Hepatitis-C elimination programme was initiated in July 2021 by The Aga Khan University Hospital (AKUH), in collaboration with PBS for AKUH, Getz Pharma and Roche Diagnostics.


Under this programme, patients are screened for Hepatitis-C and offered treatment. Since its inception, over 150 camps have been established in 35 cities to screen and treat patients.

PBS ZAKAT LABORATORY PROGRAMME - AT A GLANCE

AKU's core principles of IQRA (Impact, Quality, Relevance, Access) serve as a guiding philosphy for AKUH and PBS for AKUH. PBS for AKUH has strived to ensure underprivileged individuals get access to quality healthcare, possible only with the kind support of its donors.

AKUH manages an extensive patient access programme with 248 laboratories offering welfare. In addition, PBS also helps in providing Zakat at 118 of these laboratories. This ensures indigent patients get access to quality diagnostics at a very affordable cost.

The Zakat programme at AKUH laboratories was initiated in October 2020, and now caters to over 80,000 patient visits each year.

Due to rising inflation, various patients have been utilizing Zakat from these laboratories.

In line with its vision, and the core principles of IQRA, PBS for AKUH is considering scaling up this programme to offer Zakat at all 248 laboratories across the country.
