From Diagnosis to Care: Husna's Story



Until the age of 10, Husna was a healthy and active child. Everything changed when she began experiencing frequent fevers, difficulty breathing and exhaustion after walking short distances. She developed a persistent cough, chest tightness and general weakness. Her parents grew increasingly alarmed. With limited means and no clear diagnosis, they watched helplessly as their daughter's condition worsened.

Husna's father, a rickshaw driver in Karachi, did all he could to seek help. Eventually, another not-for-profit organisation referred the family to AKUH. By the time she arrived, Husna was in a critical state — her condition had gone undiagnosed for far too long.

At AKUH, doctors quickly identified that she was suffering from acute pulmonary complications, including pneumonia and fluid build-up in her lungs. She was immediately admitted and placed under specialised care. Her story did not end there. Further assessments revealed that Husna also had other underlying health conditions affecting her respiratory and immune systems, which AKUH's multidisciplinary team began treating as part of a comprehensive care plan. She also showed signs of chronic inflammation, nutritional deficiencies and related complications.

Thanks to timely intervention and ongoing support, Husna's health has improved. Her breathing has stabilised, she is regaining her strength and is looking forward to returning to school.

Her journey is a powerful reminder of how access to quality healthcare and early diagnosis can transform lives for patients like Husna and her family. Undetected illnesses can quietly steal a child's future. With your support, that future can be reclaimed.

From Uncertainty to Healing: Yaqoob's Story



Yaqoob, a 54-year-old man, had been suffering from persistent abdominal pain for months. Despite visiting multiple doctors, his condition remained undiagnosed, leaving him frustrated and concerned. The pain worsened over time, and his abdomen began to swell significantly, causing constant discomfort that affected every aspect of his life. He also experienced a loss of appetite, feeling weak and unable to perform his daily activities.

Over time the swelling in his abdomen became severe and he was referred to AKUH.

At AKUH, the medical team carried out multiple tests, including an endoscopy and cancer screening, and quickly diagnosed Yaqoob with abdominal tuberculosis (TB), a condition that can cause fluid buildup in the abdomen and all the symptoms he had been facing over time. Yaqoob and his family were relieved to finally have an answer to his persistent health issues. However, his son worked as a driver and they were unable to afford the cost of the tests and treatment.

Thanks to the generosity of donors to AKUH through PBS, Yaqoob was able to receive the necessary medical care and started a nine month course of TB medication.

With the correct diagnosis and treatment plan, Yaqoob's condition gradually improved. The swelling in his abdomen began to subside, and his appetite slowly returned. Over the next several months, Yaqoob adhered to his treatment regimen and regained his strength.

Thanks to the timely intervention and care he received, Yaqoob is healthy once again and free from the debilitating pain and discomfort that once defined his days.

Q: What are your thoughts about AKUH as a healthcare provider?

Shan-e-Ramzan Transmission

Hosted by Waseem Badami, a compelling conversation was led by Raheel Qamar Ahmad, Chairman Fundraising Committee & Executive Committee Member of PBS, and Dr Sadaf Altaf, Assistant Professor of Oncology at AKUH. Mr Raheel's discussion focused on the work of PBS, supporting underprivileged patients across various healthcare needs, while Dr Sadaf spoke about paediatric cancer and its devastating impact on children.

In Pakistan, approximately 8,000 children are diagnosed with cancer each year, yet survival rates remain significantly lower than in high-income countries. This disparity is often due to delayed diagnoses, limited access to specialised care, and financial constraints. AKUH addresses these challenges by providing cutting-edge, comprehensive treatment for children battling cancer, while your Zakat and donations via PBS enable underprivileged families to access life-saving treatment for paediatric cancer patients across Pakistan.






The Phlebotomy Zakat Programme

The Phlebotomy Zakat Programme was launched in 2020 to subsidies laboratory tests for zakat mustahiq patients. Starting with just two laboratories, the support is now being provided in 119 laboratories nationwide, helping underserved communities access essential diagnostic services with dignity and ease. By combining diagnostic excellence with compassion, AKUH - through PBS - is addressing a critical gap in access to healthcare. Since the Programme's inception over 300,000 patient visits have been supported due to your generous contributions to the Phlebotomy Zakat Programme.

Your continued generosity to PBS can enable us to meet the growing demand for subsidised laboratory tests for needy patients.
